



In order to ensure that learning is continued, irrespective of lockdown and/or isolation, Wyke Regis Primary Federation has developed the following plan to ensure that children’s learning is not interrupted. This plan offers remote learning opportunities whilst also acknowledging that some households have limited access to devices and would require hard copies of work and resources.

<p>What will happen if my child needs to isolate whilst their class is still at school?</p> <p>If your child needs to self-isolate, please contact the school office. Remote learning is always available and can be found either on Google Classroom or Tapestry and will be labelled Remote Learning – Week 1. This will mean that your child has the immediate opportunity to continue their learning.</p> <p>Should the period of isolation finish early (e.g. because of a negative test), your child can then return to school and continue to learn in class.</p> <p>If the period of isolation continues for a second week, they should then access the next week’s learning on Google Classroom or Tapestry labelled Remote Learning – Week 2.</p>
<p>How will class teachers be communicating with us during this time?</p> <p>During the first week of isolation, the class teacher will be in touch via Google Classroom or Tapestry to ‘check in’ with remote learning. You can also contact them by either posting on these platforms or by emailing the school office. (junoffice@wykeregisfed.dorset.sch.uk or infooffice@wykeregisfed.dorset.sch.uk)</p> <p>Google Classroom and Tapestry are a key part of our communication during this time as they allow direct feedback between home and class teachers.</p>
<p>I have heard about Google Classroom and Tapestry – what are they?</p> <p>They are both online learning platforms which enable teachers to post learning opportunities for your child to complete. These may be in a range of different formats such as watching a maths video, completing a worksheet, doing some research on a topic or uploading a video or photograph. The task will state clearly what is expected of your child but please contact the class teacher if you are unsure. Both of these platforms can be accessed on any device and are free to download at the App Store or Google Play.</p>
<p>What will be on the remote learning timetable?</p> <p>Each day will consist of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An English based task • A daily maths lesson (via White Rose maths) • A reading, spelling or phonics task • A foundation subject task or tasks (e.g. geography, art, RE etc) that links to the current topic. <p>Where possible, teachers will utilise online resources and learning will link to what is happening in school. There is a list of ‘additional resources/learning platforms’ such as Mathletics, TT Rockstars, Accelerated Reader and Numbots that you can also access from home. You will find login details in your child’s reading record. Not all children have access to all of the resources as some are dependent on the year group they are in or their individual needs.</p>
<p>What will happen if my child’s ‘bubble’ needs to isolate?</p> <p>If there is an occasion where your child’s class bubble needs to isolate, your child’s class teacher will post the remote learning on Google Classroom and Tapestry. Class teachers and TAs will be available to contact through these apps should you have any questions about the remote learning.</p>
<p>What happens if I cannot access the remote learning tasks?</p> <p>If you are unable to access the internet, then please contact the school office so that hard copies can be organised.</p>

Your child should only complete remote learning if they are well enough to do so.
