


Nursery







Year 4 have been working collaboratively on a number of different projects. We learnt about the graffiti activist Keith Haring and created large scale graffiti panels using

his artwork as a starting point. We have also been working in pairs to find as many different equivalent fractions as we could using all sorts of different

resources.







Year 5 are carrying out a range of different science experiments to help us with our designs for making Viking long boats. This particular experiment was to see how to waterproof material for a sail. We tried a range of substances such as cooking oil, shoe polish, PVA glue and washing up liquid to see if any of them could waterproof the material. It was an exciting experiment which got a little bit messy at times. The shoe polish and oil were particularly successful. The children found it fun, interesting and successful.





In Year 6, the children have been full of excitement about being back in school and seeing their friends. During the first week, we read lots of picture books to spark our

imaginations and get us talking. We have had a very creative half term, which has involved designing and making bridges, creating artwork linked to The Tin Forest and carrying out practical investigations into how light travels.
