As we approach the end of another difficult and strange school year on behalf of the Governing Body I would like to thank everyone involved in the school in any way. For parents and the children for having to adjust to school routines and interaction with others (one way systems, staggered starts and wearing of masks) and all staying so positive and cooperative throughout. Also to all the teachers, TAs and support staff for working so hard despite constraints, changes to working conditions and lots of the usual activities not able to happen, but still maintaining a proactive curriculum and good standard of teaching and learning. Thank you to every one of you!!!!! Who knows what September will hold, although the Government is opening things up, it seems we will be continuing to live



with COVID19 albeit trying to manage things differently. I also wanted to share with you some good news that the federation has invested in two Automatic External Defibrillator (AEDs), one for each site to improve the response to Adults and Children in the event of a sudden cardiac arrest on site. The AEDs we have purchased are suitable for both children and adults and used in conjunction with Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) gives those in cardiac arrest the best chance of survival if deployed within a minute or so and used until the ambulance arrives. We will be providing training for all adults who work in the school so that they can confidently

deploy and use the AEDS at a moments notice at any time that the school is in use. We also hope to be offering sessions for parents who wish to learn about CPR & AEDs early in the new school year. 
across the bay towards Portland. Our resident seagull, Barry, has enjoyed watching the
