

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Listen to and respond to what others say.
Express their feelings and consider the feelings of others.
Show resilience and perseverance in the face of challenge.
Identify and moderate their own feelings socially and emotionally.

Communication and Language

Listen to and talk about stories to build familiarity and understanding.
Retell Handa's Surprise and The Enormous Turnip, once they have developed a deep familiarity with the text; some as exact repetition and some in their own words.
Learn and use new vocabulary in different contexts.

Physical Development

Develop confidence, competence, precision and accuracy when engaging in activities that involve a ball
Using Kinetic Letters to develop their core muscle strength to achieve a good posture when sitting at a table or sitting on the floor.
Develop a good pencil grip and develop the foundations of a handwriting style which is fast, accurate and efficient.
Know and talk about the different factors that support their overall health and wellbeing, physical activity, healthy eating and tooth brushing.

Literacy

Blend sounds into words, so that they can read and write short words made up of known letter-sound correspondences.
Read and write some letter groups that each represent one sound and say sounds for them.
Read and write a few common exception words eg the, I, put.
Use story maps to make and tell stories

Mathematics

Link the number symbol (numeral) with its cardinal number value up to number 10.
Compare numbers and understand the 'one more than/one less than' relationship between consecutive numbers.
Explore the composition of numbers to 10.
Develop confidence to recall number bonds for numbers 0-10.
Know the names of solid and flat shapes and describe them and recognise a shape can have other shapes within it, just as numbers can.

Expressive art and design

Explore, use and refine a variety of artistic effects to express their ideas and feelings using African art as a stimulus.
Return to and build on their previous learning, refining ideas and developing their ability to represent them.
Create collaboratively sharing ideas, resources and skills.
Listen attentively, move to and talk about music, expressing their feelings and responses.

Understanding the World

RE: New beginnings: - recognise that people have different beliefs and celebrate special times in different ways.
Recognise some similarities and differences between life in this country and life in other countries.
Explore the natural world around them and describe what they see, hear and feel whilst outside.
