Children will begin to

- understand that there is a normal range of emotions
- recognise and talk about their and others' emotions
- understand how important relationships are in making us feel happy and secure and how people choose to make friends.
- take practical steps in a range of contexts to improve or support respectful relationships with children and adults.
- recognise how important they are to ensuring their team functions as best it can

History

Finding out about the lives of significant individuals in the past who have contributed to national and international achievements. Comparing aspects of life in different periods.

Examples of some significant historical people: Blackbeard, Anne Bonny and Henry Strangways: all famous pirates but why do we remember them ?

Science:

As scientists we will be learning about materials and their properties. We will learn where materials come from and if they are natural or manmade. We will be grouping and comparing materials in various ways and investigating their properties and suitability for different purposes.

We will also be learning about the 4 seasons and examining Autumn in closer detail.

Maths:

Place value within 10

Identifying and representing numbers using objects and pictorial representations. Read and write numbers from 1 to 20 in numerals and words. Counting and recognising numbers 1-20.

Addition and subtraction.

Reading, writing and interpreting mathematical statements involving addition (+), subtraction (-) and equals (=) signs.

Representing and using number bonds and related subtraction facts within 20. Adding and subtracting one-digit and two-digit numbers to 20, including zero. Solving one-step problems that involve addition and subtraction, using concrete objects and pictorial representations.

Geometry and shape

Naming, sorting and identifying 3D shapes.

Shape treasure hunt.

Describing 3D and 2D shapes.

English:

As writers we will be learning to write a character description about a pirate in the form of a Wanted poster. This will be based on class book "The Pirates Next Door."

The skills we will need are:

Writing sentences by saying out loud what they are going to write about.

Learning to read and spell the words: **there, was, the, his, they, all, that, you**

Using capital letters for names of people, places, days of the week and the personal pronoun "I".

Leaving spaces between words and using a full stop, exclamation mark or question mark to end a sentence

We will be playing team building games this half term.

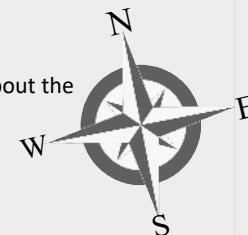
Geography
