## ATTENDANCE



Every week, our attendance figures are compared with the national percentages and these are shared within school and with the governors.

One of our key measures is PERSISTENT ABSENTEEISM - the number of children whose attendance is less than 90%. Currently this is 16% (58 children) at the Junior School and 17% (44 children) at the Infant School. Prior to covid, these figures were closer to 8%.

The table below shows how attendance links to attainment. The figures show how many children are reaching the expected levels in reading, writing and maths when their attendance is above 95% and when it is below 90%. Put simply, if children aren't here, we can't teach them. Let's try to do everything we can to promote good attendance to ensure that your child has the best chance to be successful.

Well done 3B - two weeks of 100% attendance as a class!

Our topic work has seen the children learn all about planet Earth. The Poles, Equator and the features associated with the regions. In computing we've been learning how to use different artistic tools whilst learning about famous artists and their unique styles.

The whole team wishes you and your families a lovely Christmas and a happy new year!










It's been another busy half term in Year 4. Our topic has been 'Food Glorious Food' and we have had some fabulous creations. We've researched pasta sauces that are on the market and evaluated what we liked about them so that we could then design our own. Finally, we have used the skills we learnt in English to write a set of instructions for how to make our pasta sauce. Alongside this, we have been rehearsing for our Christingle Services, which we hope you enjoyed.







Year 5 have been busy this half-term with lots of exciting things such as the Space Dome, Winchester Science Museum and Christingle Services. Our topic has been 'Out of This World', and the children have been exploring the planets that make up our solar system. We had an incredible time working scientifically to make our own model rockets. We used Alka Seltzer and water to create a chemical reaction that launched our rockets.





When we were waiting for the rocket to go off, it was really nerve wracking because we were really scared that it would go off on our hand! Whilst setting it up, you also had to be really quick.
